**ACCESS to Success** is a campus-wide initiative designed to help you achieve success as a student, especially during your first year.

Choose one or more of the following **ACCESS** programs!

#### ◆ **The Freshman Mentoring Network**

Everyone needs a guide, especially when entering unfamiliar territory. Signing up for a mentor is a terrific way to learn the ropes and get acquainted with college life. Mentors are students, staff or faculty members who will answer your questions about UWM and help you find your way.

#### ◆ **First Year Transition Courses**

A great way for you to have a successful first semester in college is to enroll in a course designed to challenge your intellectual curiosity and ability while also preparing you for college and your intended major.



Freshman seminars are small classes on interesting topics that count toward UWM's undergraduate requirements for general education.

If you are entering a professional major, you have the option of first year transition courses designed to introduce you to your major, your faculty, and your career options.

Your advisor can assist you in selecting a First Year Transition Course.

#### ◆ **Tutoring, Supplemental Instruction and Team Teaching**

There are many services available to you from TARC, the Tutoring and Academic Resource Center, and from programs across campus that coordinate tutoring with TARC. Free tutoring is available for more than eighty 100- and 200-level courses, including math, English, and large lecture courses. Tutoring is also available to you using Desire 2 Learn (D2L), an online program.

Supplemental instruction (SI) is offered to help you in courses that may seem difficult. SI sections meet two or three times per week and are directed by other advanced students who plan the sessions with the course instructor.



You may also want to join a study group. If so, the Team Teaching Program is a good starting point. This program is designed to bring more personal attention to large lecture classes. Students within the class are selected as preceptors; they lead study groups and assist the professor.

#### ◆ **Academic Advising**

Your best source of information and encouragement is your assigned academic advisor. Advisors listen to your concerns and questions, lead you through the maze of degree requirements, and link you to campus resources. Make an appointment early in the semester so that you are well acquainted with your advisor before the rush of registration begins for the next semester.

Multicultural students are also encouraged to make use of UWM's new Multicultural Student Center, located in Bolton 187. Also located on the first floor of Bolton Hall are African American Student Academic Services, American Indian Student Services, the Roberto Hernandez Center, and Southeast Asian Student Academic Services.
