Eligibility Criteria

- Full-time Business-intended Freshman or Sophomore or
- Full-time Junior or Senior admitted to the major and enrolled in the Lubar School of Business, with
- Preference for Freshmen
- Academic achievement in high school
- African American
- Resident of the City of Milwaukee at the time of application
- Demonstrated financial need
- Good character, which may be evidenced by nomination statement from the Education Committee of the Milwaukee Innercity Congregations Allied for Hope (MICAHA), or by letter of recommendation from MICAHA or one of its member congregations.
- Renewable for recipients continuing to meet criteria as outlined in their award letters

UWM business alumnus Dennis ('66) and Sandy Kuester established the Dennis and Sandy Kuester Scholarship to provide scholarship assistance to African Americans from the City of Milwaukee who are Business-intended or admitted into their major in the Lubar School of Business. Their belief, after having been involved in various non-profit activities within this area, is that education is the key to rising above the obstacles that currently exist for young people in our city.

The scholarship amount (two-thirds of the current full cost including in-state tuition, books, fees, and on-campus room and board) is intended to allow students a conducive environment in which to pursue their college education.

This unique scholarship considers good character in addition to other criteria. Applicants should exhibit high standards of ethics and morality
