UWM Baccalaureate Degree: Bachelor of Science, Kinesiology with submajor in Exercise and Fitness

PURPOSE:

Madison Area Technical College's two year program in Recreation Services Activity/Fitness Leader prepares students with theoretical knowledge and practical skills necessary to enter the health, fitness, and recreation settings. Graduates are able to perform many of the duties assigned in the general recreation programming areas, and some of those assigned in the health and fitness areas. In addition, it provides a knowledge base in liberal arts, technical support, and basic operations associated with private and commercial recreational fitness providers.

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee baccalaureate degree program administered through the Department of Human Kinetics prepares individuals for leadership positions in the exercise and fitness industry. The graduate is prepared to perform fitness assessments, design individualized exercise programs, administer training regimes, develop and implement various exercise/fitness programs, and manage within the health club industry. UWM's program prepares students to write a national certification examination and become certified through the American College of Sports Medicine.

This articulation agreement affords those students having an Associate Degree from Madison Area Technical College in Recreation Services Activity/Fitness Leader the opportunity to enter UWM's Kinesiology (Submajor: Exercise and Fitness) with the credits and coursework specified below:

1. The UW-Milwaukee baccalaureate candidate must also meet UWM's General Education and Cultural Diversity Requirements.
2. Program-to-Program transfer courses/credits are accepted only for the degrees specified in this agreement. A change of major invalidates these courses/credits for transfer unless they are approved within some other Program-to-Program Articulation Agreement for a different major at UW-Milwaukee.
3. Course equivalencies specified in this articulation agreement are subject to change in the event that the course curricula of either institution undergo revision.
4. Coursework must have been taken since January 1, 1994. This agreement may not apply to students who had complete college work prior to enrolling at Madison Area Technical College.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This agreement is effective as of September 1, 1995, and covers courses completed during the Spring 1994 semester and thereafter.
