Other Requirements for entry into the major

Students need to have an overall "C" (2.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale) average on 12 or more attempted credits.

Students may transfer up to half the credits required for graduation from UWM, but usually not more than 72 credits.

Special Notes

The major in anthropology requires 33 credits within the department, including ANTHRO

101, 102, 103, and one course from each of the curriculum categories (Physical Anthropology, Archaeology, Ethnology & Related Sociocultural Subjects, Linguistic Anthropology, Area Courses, Methods Courses).

At least 15 credits in advanced-level courses (numbered 300 or above) must be taken in residence at UWM.

Students majoring in anthropology must earn a GPA of 2.5 or better in anthropology courses, including transfer work. Departments may require higher GPAs for graduation.

It is recommended that you declare your Anthropology major after completing 45 credits but before completing 75 credits. Contact the appropriate academic department for more information. Failure to declare the major before 75 credits have been earned may result in a delay of graduation.

Please note that at eight of the 13 UW College campuses have a UW Milwaukee advisor who is available for advising students who intend to major in any of the majors at UW Milwaukee in the College of Letters and Science.

You can be *guaranteed* admission to UW-Milwaukee by participating in the UW Colleges [Guaranteed Transfer Program](#). After fulfilling certain credit and grade point average requirements, you will transfer with the same rights and privileges as those who begin their education at UWM.
