Application Procedure

Submit a [UW System application](#) form and all appropriate transcripts to the [Department of Enrollment Services](#). If you meet UWM standard admission requirements which are listed below, you will be admitted directly into the [School of Architecture and Urban Planning](#) with a Pre-Architecture classification.

Level 1 Application Deadlines:

- **Summer/Fall semester:** February 1
- **Spring semester:** November 1

Students applying after the Application Deadline may be considered on a space available basis.

Course Requirements for Level 1 (Pre-Architecture)

English and Math Competencies with a grade of C or better:

* Physics- Completion of a college-level physics course is required (equivalent to UWM's Physics 107, 120 or higher). The majority of the UW-Colleges offer Physics 107.

Admission Requirements for entry into Level 1 (Pre-Architecture)

Freshman/Sophomores

Level 1 (Pre-Architecture) Earn at least a 2.5 undergraduate GPA on 24 attempted credits.

Juniors/Seniors

Level 2 (Architectural Studies) Earn at least a 2.75 GP on overall college record and required architecture courses. A 2.75 GP does not guarantee admission. Admission is contingent upon available staffing and facilities. Priority is given to applicants with the strongest academic records and design portfolios. The BSAS committee determines who gains admission into Level

2.

Required Courses for entry into Level 2 (Architectural Studies) that are not available in the UW Colleges' Curriculum

For this program, you are encouraged to transfer to UWM after two semesters at a UWC campus. Not all course work required for entry into the major is available at a UWC campus. It is possible to be concurrently enrolled at a UWC and at UWM. Concurrent enrollment would allow you to take the required courses for your major at UWM while finishing up other course work at a UWC. Please contact an advisor at the UWC to discuss your options.

ARCH 100	Introduction to Architecture, 3 credits
ARCH 101	Introduction to Architectural Theory, 3 credits
ARCH 200	Architectural Fundamentals I, 5 credits
ARCH 201	Architectural Fundamentals II, 5 credits
ARCH 210	Introduction to Building Technologies, 3 credits

* In addition to these five Architecture classes offered at UWM, you must fulfill the General Education Requirements (see #6) before entering Level 2/Architectural Studies. While the five Architecture courses are only offered at UWM, courses fulfilling the General Education Requirements can be completed at a UWC campus.

*** An additional 6 credits beyond what is listed above in Art, Humanities, Natural Science, or Social Science is required for the Architecture program.
