

## UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN-MILWAUKEE INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS WITH TRANSFER CREDIT

### **ALL STUDENTS**

In order to have Advanced Placement (AP) test results evaluated for credit at UWM, students must submit official AP scores. A score of 3 or higher is required for credit. Please contact the College Board at (609) 921-9000, or on the web at [www.collegeboard.com](http://www.collegeboard.com), for information on ordering these scores.

In order to have International Baccalaureate (IB) test results evaluated for credit at UWM, student must submit official IB scores. Please contact the International Baccalaureate Organization at (212) 696-4464, on the web at <http://www.ibo.org/graduates/transcripts/index.cfm>.

Credits earned by examination at another college or university are not transferable to UWM.

### **TRANSFERS FROM TWO-YEAR COLLEGES**

Students who previously attended an accredited two year institution are generally allowed to transfer up to 72 credits to UWM. This includes transfer students from the University of Wisconsin Colleges, and from the liberal arts programs at Madison Area Technical College, Milwaukee Area Technical College, Nicolet Area Technical College, Chippewa Valley Technical College, and Western Technical College.

### **TRANSFERS FROM THE WISCONSIN TECHNICAL COLLEGE SYSTEM**

Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) students may transfer a maximum of 30 credits of applied associate degree general education courses in communication, behavioral science, social science, natural science, and mathematics. Students may also be eligible to transfer certain technical support and/or occupational credits when there is a direct relationship between an associate degree program and a UWM program and an articulation agreement exists. Course acceptance at other schools within the UW System is dependent upon each institution's policy.

In most cases, only accepted credits appear on the credit evaluation. Credits taken in a one-year vocational/technical program are not listed and are not transferable to UWM.

### **MUSIC STUDENTS**

UWM Music course equivalents will be assigned by the Music Department after auditions with applied music faculty, interviews with theory faculty, and/or appropriate placement tests are completed.

**NURSING STUDENTS**

Credits more than ten years old may not apply to prerequisites for the clinical nursing program. Please see an academic advisor in the School of Nursing for further information.
