STUDENT ORGANIZATION REGISTRATION

The registration process has been developed to give the university community an accurate listing of active student groups on campus. Registration does not mean the university supports or adheres to the views held or the positions taken by registered student organizations. Persons interested in starting a student organization should contact the Student Activities Office for a registration form, room 350 Union.

Registration is an annual process and **must be renewed for each academic year**. All student organizations shall register annually by filing a **Registration Renewal Contract** with the Student Activities Office. These forms will be mailed to every student organization mailbox at least one week prior to the beginning of classes or may be obtained from the Student Activities Office.

Organizations failing to renew their registrations on time will have their charter canceled and will be listed as Inactive. **Inactive Organizations** lose any Union office space, office equipment, use of University facilities, and/or segregated fees that the group has been allocated.

No student organization will be officially registered with the University if the Student Activities Office determines that the group's actions or activities are detrimental to the educational purposes of the University and/or the welfare of the students.

UWM HISTORY AND TRADITIONS

Although it traces its origin to the Milwaukee State Normal School, which was founded in 1885 and subsequently became Wisconsin State College, UWM is relatively young. Since its establishment in 1956 with the merger of Wisconsin State College and the UW Extension Division in Milwaukee, UWM has exploded onto the Milwaukee skyline and into the intellectual and economic life of Southeastern Wisconsin.

- UWM offers more than 120 undergraduate majors and submajors, 48 master's programs, and 23 doctoral programs.
- UWM is a community of over 28,000 students, 1,349 faculty and instructional staff, and nearly 2,000 staff members.
- The School of Continuing Education offers 1,500 noncredit, select credit and certificate programs in the Milwaukee area.
- UWM is one of two UW System institutions that grant doctoral degrees. UWM is accredited as a comprehensive doctoral and research campus by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.
- UWM is ranked as a Doctoral/Research University - Extensive by the Carnegie Foundation.

Interesting Facts

- In 1885 Wisconsin State Normal School opened; it moved to the Downer site in 1909.
- In 1920 the University of Wisconsin Extension Division formed and started teaching classes in Milwaukee.
- In the 1930s there were over 100 student organizations.
- In 1931 tuition was \$25 per semester and included books and health care.
- In the 1950s a single parking lot of 50 spaces served the Kenwood campus.
- In 1956 the Wisconsin State College and UW-Extension merged to form the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.
- Golda Meir graduated from the Milwaukee State Normal School and went on to become Prime Minister of Israel in 1969.
- UWM houses the American Geographical Soc. Collections. AGS is one of the oldest and most respected geographical societies.
- UWM added soccer as a varsity sport in 1973 and has since become a national power.
- UWM's last football game was in 1974, when UWM beat UW-Whitewater 26-14.

Athletics

UWM is a member of the Horizon League and competes in NCAA Division I basketball, cross-country, soccer, swimming, diving, track, men's baseball, and women's tennis and volleyball. UWM has won the Horizon League's All-Sports Award - the McCafferty Trophy - four times in the last seven years, while also winning the women's all-sports each of the last two years. Overall, the Panthers won seven Horizon League team championships in 2006-07.

The Student Community

With increasing regularity, the world's students are coming to UWM. Its globally diverse student body includes more than 700 students from other countries who are attracted by UWM's academic excellence and its urban setting, convenient to the professional, cultural and recreational advantages only a large metropolitan area can offer. The campus is a place where students with different backgrounds, talents, interests and aspirations come together to learn and share experiences. It is through shared experiences combined from the classroom, social life, residence halls and the community that students obtain a unique and exciting education.

The Milwaukee Community

UWM's 93-acre campus is located on Milwaukee's upper east side, one of the city's most attractive residential areas and home to many faculty, staff and students. UWM also is in walking distance from historic Lake Park and the beautiful Lake Michigan shoreline. The campus, an attractive combination of historic buildings and modern architecture, is a short drive or bus ride from a wealth of cultural and recreational resources. They include: the Milwaukee Art Museum, Milwaukee Public Museum, Milwaukee County Zoo, theaters, concert halls, stores, restaurants, parks, professional sports events and ethnic festivals. All of these make big cities - and Milwaukee in particular - stimulating places to live, work and go to school. Newcomers soon discover how easy it is to navigate Milwaukee, making it easy to take advantage of the city. And the U-PASS bus pass you'll receive as a student means you can hop a Milwaukee County Transit System bus during the school year to go anywhere, anytime ... without having to pay a fare.

FINDING THE RIGHT MATCH

Please ask yourself some questions:

- » What are the financial obligations, if any?
- » Was recruitment a “hard sell”? If so, why?
- » Will membership mean isolation from family and nonmember friends?
- » Will involvement enhance or deter achievement of my academic and career goals?

BALANCE

It is important to remember that you could get “too” involved. Balance your school work, friends, family, and work schedules with your involvement opportunities so they compliment one another, not cause you to go crazy.

STUDENT ORGANIZATION REGISTRATION POLICIES

Relationship Between Student Organizations and the University

Student organizations are considered to be affiliated with, but not official units of, the University. As a condition for continuation of the affiliation relationship, the organization agrees to abide by University regulations. In return, the student organization gains access to selected University facilities and resources.

Student groups on the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee campus must register annually with the Student Activities Office in order to use University facilities and services. To be eligible for registration, student organizations must meet the following criteria:

1. Operate as a not-for-profit organization.
2. Consist of membership comprised mainly of UWM students.
3. Be controlled and directed by UWM Students.
4. Be related to student life on campus.
5. Abide by Federal, State and University nondiscrimination laws and policies.
6. Abide by policies set forth in the Student Organization Manual, Student Handbook, Student Association Constitution, and UW-System regulations.
7. Identify four currently-enrolled UWM students as primary contacts.
8. Does not duplicate the purpose or function of a currently registered student organization on campus, unless the need for duplication is substantiated and approved by the Student Association Senate.

Using the University's name

Student groups may only identify themselves with the University by using the following format in the organization name: “Club XYZ **at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.**” The name must not infer University endorsement of the organization’s purpose or activities, or imply that the organization is speaking on behalf of the University or any of its divisions or departments. All letterhead stationery, invoices, purchasing forms, or other printed materials for public distribution must include the statement: “Student Organization at UWM”

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Logo and the Athletic Panther Logo are registered trademarks of the university and may only be used by official university offices and departments. These logo marks include the acronym UWM, the two wavy lines, the registered trademark sign, the logo signature, the words University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, the letters UWM in any shape or form, and the Panther logo in whole or in parts. Student organizations wishing to order clothing items personalized for their organization may wish to utilize the online store at www.mygarb.com/UWMilwaukee/.

Using the University's marks

Student organizations are prohibited from using the university seal or logos on letterheads, business cards, posters, clothing, or other identifying materials. The UWM Licensing Office retains the right of approval of all uses of the university's marks. An acceptable logo has been developed by the UWM Licensing Office for student organizations. This logo can be accessed from the UWM Licensing Office in the Student Union 330 or 229-5577.

Student Organization Responsibilities

Students are subject to local, state, and federal laws and ordinances. The University expects that all student organizations will prevent unlawful actions in connection with their activities. Failure to do so could subject student organizations, the officers and members to disciplinary action. The organization acknowledges that its activities, including some which may occur on the campus of UWM, **are not eligible for liability protection under the State of Wisconsin Self-Funded Liability Program and need to obtain a special-event(s) liability policy at its own expense.**

The freedom of action granted to registered organizations implies a responsibility for the development of the direction, scope, and character of the group in order to promote UWM’s educational mission. This freedom of action is limited by the stated purpose of the organization and the rules and regulations imposed by the University and society.

Free inquiry and expression are essential in a community of scholars. As members of such a community, students are encouraged to develop a capacity for critical judgment and an independent search for truth. Freedom to learn depends upon opportunities and conditions in the classroom, on the campus, and in the larger community.

Students have the right, accorded to all persons by the Constitution, to freedom of speech, peaceable assembly, petition, and association. Students and student organizations may examine and discuss all questions of interest to them, and express opinions publicly as well as privately. They may support causes by lawful means which do not disrupt the operations of the University or the organizations accorded the use of University facilities.

Scholarships / Academic Assistance

As a Division I member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee offers aid in the form of athletic scholarships to its prospective student-athletes.

Scholarships are awarded to athletes on a one-year basis, renewable from year-to-year based on maintenance of scholastic and athletic commitment.

Full and partial scholarships are available in all 15 varsity sports. Full scholarships include the cost of room and board, in addition to tuition, books and fees. Scholarships are based on athletic ability and projected academic success at UWM.

Prospective student-athletes should contact the respective UWM coach in their sport for more information, and are encouraged to contact the Student Financial Aid Office for additional assistance.

Academic Assistance Center: The Athletic Department Academic Assistance Center is located in the Pavilion. The center is a quiet study area that features a computer lab and tutoring rooms, as well as and other academic resources for student athletes.

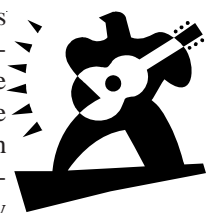

STUDENT GOVERNANCE



The Student Association (SA) is the official student governing organization comprised of three branches: Executive, Student Senate, and Student Court. The SA is a member of the United Council

(UC) and of the United States Student Association (USSA). Elections for the SA Senate and Executive positions take place in April; vacant Senate seats are filled internally throughout the year.

The Executive Branch of SA is comprised of four executives and a task-oriented staff that represents students at meetings and other functions within and outside the University, particularly on issues that affect students.

The legislative branch is **the Student Senate**, comprised of 45 elected students drawn from the academic units in proportion to the units' enrollment. The Senate formulates policies pertaining to student activities, charters and approves funds for student organizations, confirms student appointments to various committees, and develops and communicates student opinion on a wide range of issues. The **Senate Appropriations Committee (SAC)** is a standing committee responsible for distributing funds to student organizations.

The **University Student Court (USC)** handles cases relating to parking and vehicle regulations, student organization disputes and rule offenses. For information on the Court, how to file complaints and how to become a member, stop by Union 377, or call 229-5295.

The Union Policy Board (UPB) is responsible for the formulation and monitoring of policies for the overall operation and usage of the Union Building. For more information call 229-4366.

COMPLAINT PROCEDURES

- A. Upon receipt of a written complaint alleging misconduct or a violation of a University regulation or policy by a student organization, the Dean of Students or his designee shall investigate the complaint.
- B. The student organization shall within five (5) business days of the receipt of the complaint by the Dean of Students be notified in writing of:
 - 1) The alleged violation or misconduct which occurred and the facts on which the allegation is based.
 - 2) The date and time of a conference with the Dean of Students to discuss the complaint. Such conferences shall occur no later than twenty (20) business days after the receipt of the complaint by the Dean of Students.
 - 3) Sanctions or penalties which may be imposed.
 - 4) The right of the group at the conference to be accompanied by legal counsel or other advisor at the group's expense.
 - 5) The right of the student organization to appeal the decision of the Dean of Students.
- C. The Dean of Students shall have discretion to request, in addition to the written complaint, written statements from individuals who may have relevant information pertaining to the complaint.
- D. At the conference the Dean of Students shall preside. The organization complained against will be provided an opportunity to answer all charges and to make a presentation on its behalf including the submission of written and oral statements. Any time limits applying to the conference will be announced by the Dean of Students at least three (3) business days in advance of the conference. All communication will be directed to and questions posed by the Dean of Students. In the event of the presence of opposing parties, cross examination and other forms of verbal exchange between those present will not be permitted. The Dean of Students may request the attendance of students. Students in attendance are expected to reply personally to questions directed to them but may, on the advice of counsel, decline to answer. Conferences held pursuant to complaints of student organization misconduct shall be closed.
- E. Within fifteen (15) business days following the conference, the Dean of Students shall send his/her written decision to the student organization. A copy shall also be sent to the complainant.

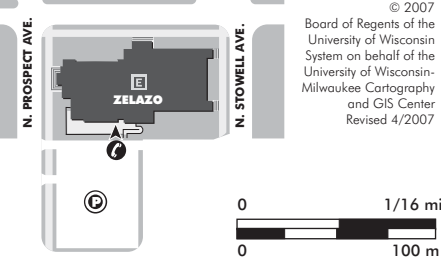


GETTING TO CAMPUS BY CAR
