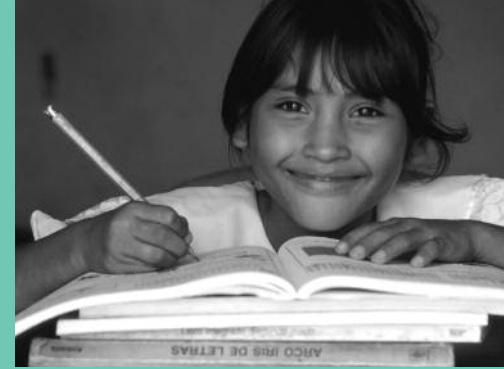

- Being Present
- Listening
- Empathy
- Meaning Making
