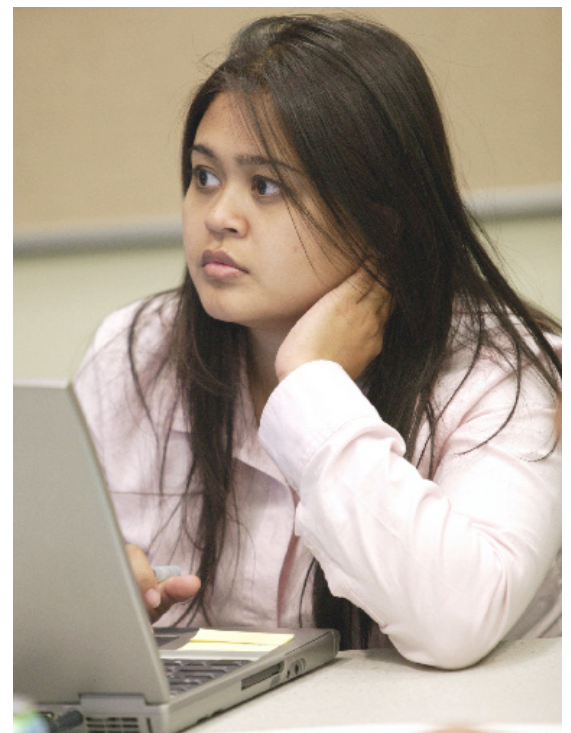

This online master's degree program will prepare you for positions of leadership to meet the broad spectrum of adult learning needs that exist in today's dynamic and complex society. The human resources and workforce development focus area emphasizes ways in which adult education works with human resource development, continuing professional education, training, and organizational development.

Human resource development professionals are often employed within learning environments to provide educational activities in preparation for employment or to enhance the productivity and job-related performance of employees. Full- and part-time career opportunities in administration, development, and implementation of programs involving adult learners are offered in business and industry, health care, education, public service, government, charitable and civic organizations, and professional associations. This area of study attracts students from a wide variety of fields including business, communications, education, psychology, sociology, and economics, among others.
