If you are having difficulty passing any portion of the PRAXIS I, please contact your academic advisor prior to taking the test a third time.
	Initial Certification: The applicant must be in the process of obtaining or already have an initial certification.

- Current Criminal Bureau Check (CBC) submitted to the Field Experience Office.
