Application to the World Languages Post Baccalaureate Teacher Certification Program requires satisfactory completion of the minimum application requirements listed below. CUM GPA: Content GPA:	GPA Requirement: The applicant must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 on all coursework completed for undergraduate credit. In addition, a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75 is required in all World Languages courses.
	Praxis I: Pre-Professional Skills Test Requirement: The applicant must have their official Praxis I scores with minimum scores as follows: Reading 175, Writing 174, and Math 173. If you are having difficulty passing any portion of the PRAXIS I, please contact your academic advisor prior to taking the test a third time.
	Initial Certification: The applicant must be in the process of obtaining or already have an initial certification.
